## ENNO LANGFELDT – June 27, 2016: 18 years of teaching is over!

**Professor Dr. Enno Langfeldt** has been retired for many years; wrote meaningful articles for our magazine, actively participated in our conferences in Värska and reviewed the articles of the authors of our magazine at a good level.

**On June 27, 2016**, he gave a farewell lecture at the Department of Economics at the Kiel University of Applied Sciences and was cordially retired by both students and colleagues.

After 20 years of teaching at Kiel University of Applied Sciences, Prof. Dr. Enno Langfeldt gave his last lecture before his well-deserved retirement in June this year. The theme of the lecture was the current monetary policy of the European Central Bank. Prof. Dr. Enno Langfeldt also used the farewell lecture to inform the colleagues and staff of the department about his experience of 30 years of teaching.

In general, a trained banker can look back on almost 50 years of experience in the business field. After completing his banking internship at Deutsche Bank in Kiel, he also studied economics in the capital of Schleswig-Holstein, which he graduated five years later.

In the mid-70s, Professor Dr. Enno Langfeldt started working at the Kiel Institute for the World Economy - a period in which he supplemented his research in the field of monetary policy, economic analysis and forecasting, and the shadow economy. Prof. dr. Enno Langfeldt worked at Kiel University of Applied Sciences since 1998.

Prof. Enno Langfeldt also gave an interview in which he talked about excerpts from his farewell lecture and the stories and congratulations of his colleagues, as well as the cornerstones of his career, also about how he managed to turn his hobby into a profession and how the student body has changed during his career.

As a farewell, the President of the Kiel University of Applied Sciences, Professor Dr. Udo Beer, presented the economics professor with a Document.

After 30 years as a professor of economics, finance and public administration, Professor Dr. Enno Langfeldt took a well-deserved retirement.

The editorial board of our magazine and the organizers of the conference also thank Enno for the excellent cooperation and wish him good health, success and happiness in his future activities.
